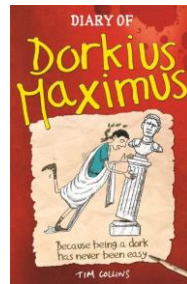
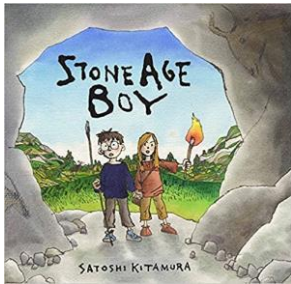
What we are covering this term:

Organisation
